## Clergy Notes

**“You will always have the poor among you,  
but you will not always have me.”**

**John 12:8**

Greetings. Many of you know about the illness I picked up somewhere in Belize as I attended a conference sponsored by Episcopal Relief and Development. While the illness was pretty scary, I don't want it to overshadow the trip and what I experienced there. There were so many life lessons, and I want to share a couple of them with you.

The group stayed in Belize City and took daily trips to the far reaches of the country to see Episcopal Relief and Development projects in action. As Americans, we were often reminded that Belize is still, in fact, in a third-world country. At the hotel, hot showers were a rare and pleasant surprise, and the air conditioning shuddered and died several times, leaving us steamy and damp. During site visits to the surrounding countryside, we were accosted by mosquitoes, water buffaloes, and mysterious stench. And, there were other surprises.

One day, our bus just quit. We sat there—hot and helpless—for a couple of hours. Another day, the bus driver stopped and ordered us off the bus. “Too muddy,” he said, as he asked us to walk the remaining half mile. “Rumor has it” that there are many new, hip resorts in Belize; If there are, I didn't see them.

What I will remember most about the trip is what I learned about human nature. First, I will remember that several of my colleagues were embarrassingly whiny. The day our bus broke on a rural road, many people panicked and whined, and one actually called the Episcopal Church Headquarters in New York City on his cell phone to complain (as if his call would get a fan belt to our bus faster). On the day we were forced off the bus because of a washed out road, several people murmured about the bus driver's “attitude.”

Others whined that the conference planners should have anticipated such a muddy mess, and when the air conditioning at our hotel broke, these same few threatened to refuse to pay their hotel bills. There is nothing like traveling to bring out one's true colors! Scenes from the

Summer's arrival provides some sense of relief; Students are not the only ones who enjoy summer vacation! I will continue, as most teachers do, teaching (I participate in summer music camp and provide private lessons.), learning (I'm in the midst of an online course.), and being actively involved (As you read this, I am attending the National Education Association Annual Meeting as an Illinois delegate in New Orleans.). **I will also help to spread the Good News at Bibletimes Marketplace in August.** Somewhere in there, I hope to relax!

But, as most of us go forward with our summer plans, there is still a cloud hanging over our heads: The economic crisis has not taken a vacation.

**At St. Charles, we continue to feel this crisis reflected in our financial reality.**

Our operations budget, that which keeps the doors open and the lights on, is extremely tight. If we are to continue paying our bills on time and giving the staff their salaries, we need to get pledges up-to-date. If you are behind in your pledging, please pay up. If you will be gone in the next month or so, please consider paying in advance; Better yet, sign up for automatic payments and when life gets busy, you won't have to remember to make your pledge payments! If you need to change your pledge status, call Fr. Bill and let him know, so the vestry can adjust the budget accordingly.

Some people get the "operations" budget (monthly bills and the diocesan pledge, for example) confused with "capital" funds.

**Yes, the vestry is continuing to pursue the parking lot improvements.** The parking lot is a completely different fund than day-to-day operations money; The vestry wouldn't try to pay for the parking lot with the annual operations budget, any more than we would try to pay the electric bill with the endowment fund. Once estimates on the parking lot have been gathered, the vestry will be asked to approve the next step and begin a capital campaign to raise funds to pay for the project. **We, in no way, want the capital campaign to effect pledges; Both are important in their own way.**

Later this year, we will also have the opportunity to learn more about a third kind of giving: legacy giving. Legacy giving is more than leaving the church money in your will; A legacy can also include endowment gifts and planned giving. Keep your eyes open for opportunities to discover how you can share your time, talent, and treasure now— and in the years to come. Workshops to help your family plan will be organized in the next year. Plan to plan.

Until then, enjoy the gift of summer.

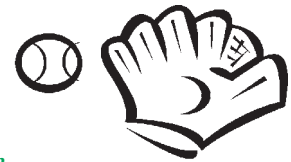

Sr. Judy Yunkers who coordinates “Mission in the Mountains” told the SCEC missionaries who trekked to Prestonburg this June that they had “**set the bar high**” for the mission groups to follow. With four projects squeezed into four workdays, they used every minute to its fullest. Their projects included: constructing and plumbing two showers ■ replacing windows in a trailer for one of the families who are “clients” of St. James Episcopal’s Food Pantry ■ clearing a yard at a house to be used by the new priest ■ building walls in a large room in the church to create an apartment for the clergy to use at St. James. **Each project presented more challenges than anticipated, but the group rose to the occasion.**

A report from Sarah Vitel says:

*“Everyone who came along on the mission trip had their own individual role in brightening the lives of the people we’d went to help. While in Kentucky, Aidan, Andrew, Eric, Holly, and I went to a house that was going to be made ready for the church’s new priest to live in. We did hours of yard work for three days. It might not have been our preferred task to complete, but everyone did it without complaining. **I’m proud of everyone who went on the mission trip and of my group in particular** because even after we found out on the last day that the house’s water system was completely trashed, nobody was a poor sport. Overall, it was a lot of hard work, but it was an amazing trip.”* (There will more from our youth in an upcoming sermon on the Mission Trip!)

Sam McDonald, Canon to the Ordinary in the Diocese of Lexington, told the group that **they made an impact on the community and the church that will be felt and appreciated for years to come!**

# FULFILLING God's VISION

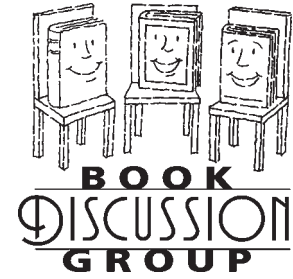
**I will pour out my spirit on all flesh;

Israelites wandering in the desert murmuring against Moses wafted through my consciousness.

On an up note, I will also remember the Belizeans we met. Julia, a farmer, thanked us for a micro loan that has allowed her to double the production on her farm. Deaf children, signed “thank you” to us, because ERD underwrites their special ed teacher’s salary, allowing them to attend school. Sparkly-eyed, elementary-aged kids giggled as they led us behind their classroom to show us their “School-yard Garden,” which is under-written by ERD. (This garden, tended exclusively by the students, provides fresh fruit and vegetables for those students who do not have enough to eat.) Strangers embraced strangers—all of us brothers and sisters in Christ, working to bring hope to the hopeless in a hurting world—while exchanging the peace during the Sunday Eucharist at the oldest Cathedral in Central America. Human nature. The good and the bad.

As you take time off this summer, remember that God does not. That people still struggle to find enough food, that mudslides happen, and that busses break down. As God’s hands and feet at work in a hurting world, we have choices. I pray that we will choose wisely as we discern whose needs we must attend to and how we will respond to the surprises that we encounter on the way.

SCEC has been helping Hesed House since 1985. We now serve 120 to 150 men, women, and, unfortunately, an increasing number of children at **PADS** on the third Friday night, through Saturday morning, of each month. Lunch and breakfast **supplies** cost about \$150 a month and, historically, have been covered by the church's annual budget. Unfortunately, since 2007, this budget has been quickly decreased; **For 2010, our \$1800 annual supplies budget was reduced to \$500.**

Many of our SCEC families have responded with generous food and cash donations to help with the shortfall. Our ministry at Hesed House was supported, in May, by **Diana and Jim Scanlon** in memory of their fathers' (both of whom died in the month of May) generosity to the world and in thanksgiving for their passing down that spirit to their kids and grandkids; in June, by **Katie and Bob Thomson** and family in honor of Ryan and Jenni's marriage on June 19 and, in August, by **Vernette and Ed Cohen** in celebration of their 60<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary. The leadership of these families is exemplary.

All of us can continue to support the Hesed House Ministry by signing up in Ludtke Hall to **(1)** buy and bring in supplies, **(2)** provide the funds for specific supplies, **(3)** provide the funds for individual meals (We provide about 200 meals a month at a cost of \$150 or 75¢ per meal.), or **(4)** donate the entire monthly cost (\$150) in honor of a memorable occasion as the families above did.

Of course, four to six volunteers are always needed to cover the 11 p.m. to 3 a.m. shift supervising the sleeping areas (Bring a good book.) and making 160 sandwiches for 80 sack lunches for those guests who are working on Saturday, and six to eight volunteers are needed to cover the 3 to 7 a.m. shift preparing and serving breakfast.

**Thank you to all who are keeping our Hesed House ministry vibrant with their time, their talent, and their treasure!** If you would like more information about our ministry at Hesed House, please do not hesitate to contact Wink Bangs.
