Dear Congregation,

We worked with a consulting company recommended by our diocese to put this survey together to assess, at a high level, your views, and beliefs in a variety of important areas. A link to the survey can be found at the end of this letter. Please know that after the holidays we plan to schedule small group sessions to discuss your views in greater detail.

This survey is CONFIDENTIAL and is designed to be taken by EVERY MEMBER (over the age of 16) in our parish to determine those issues that are most important to you when searching for our next Rector.

Please allow about 30 minutes to complete the survey. You must complete the survey in one sitting. The program will not allow you to stop and return to finish later. If you do not believe you can complete it in one sitting, we will have paper copies available for you in Ludtke Hall after each Sunday Service in November. We will also have laptops available each Sunday if you feel you need assistance. **The survey will close on November 25th.**

We hope to have 100% participation from the congregation in this first phase of our search. YOU and your views are key to our success! The answers that you provide in the survey will give us the information needed to find the next Rector that God is calling to lead our church into the future!
